V. Matters Arising from Minutes

There were no matters arising from the minutes.

### VI. Correspondence

Chair Callwood asked members to hold any questions on correspondence until the end of the meeting, to allow for the presentations scheduled during the Chair's report to proceed.

VII. Chair's Report

a. Presentation – UVI School of Education

Dean Brown presented a proposal for special certification for UVI teacher candidates. She noted that 80 percent of VIDE teachers are not certified. The proposal is intended to increase the numbers of teachers, as well as the number of teachers who are certified. Dean Brown noted that similar measures are being implemented across the mainland to recruit teachers and address a nationwide shortage.

Members asked questions and discussed targeting students who express an interest in teaching on their graduation exit plan, incentivizing the program through compensation and program cost. Mbr. Sekou was asked to discuss the proposal further in her committee.

b. Update – St. Croix Superintendent

Dr. Monique Faulkner, State Director of Career and Technical Education discussed the VIDE's initiative to standardize CTE across the two school districts and presented a proposal for the alignment of CTE courses with core academic courses. Vice-Chair Perez Cassius will discuss the proposal further in her committee.

## VIII. IED Report

IED Bess reported on activities between August and October, which included an update on VIBE's office space in both districts, IT providers and capital projects. IED Bess also gave a financial report. Ms. Rhymer updated on the territorial scholarship program, retro val-sal payments and COVID payments.

Mbr. Richards asked about compliance with the motion to publicize scholarship recipients. Atty. Jones reminded members about federal laws against identifying students. Chair Callwood asked

Atty. Jones to work with the IED to make sure there are nothing is being violated in oublishing the scholarship recipients.

Mbr. Sekou asked for a reconciliation of the FirstBank account and the status of the COVID scholarship funds. IED Bess reported that 395 of 466 applications were completed, and staff was following up with the students with incomplete applications. Mbr. Sekou asked about the students with G.P.A.'s below 2.0. IED Bess said that letters were sent to those students. Mbr. Sekou said she would leave her other questions to executive session.

Mbr. Hendricks asked for a floor plan for the Hogensberg building and ADA compliance with the lift.

IX. Legal Counsel's Report

Atty. Jones gave a status report on Moorehead v. Board of Education and the promulgation of the Disciplinary Policy. She reminded members that they would need to incorporate recent changes to the VI History and curriculum into the promotion and graduation requirements.

- X. Standing and AD-Hoc Committee Reports
  - a. Schools, Plants and Facilities

Mbr. Hendricks reported on the committee's approach to the Act 8717 requirements and intention to create a survey to assess if parents and students are aware, informed or engaged.

c. Public/Private Liaison

AED Prentice presented for Mbr. Lockhart and reported that the committee worked on press releases, partnered with banks on financial literacy and engaged with PTA's.

d. Finance and Collections

Mbr. Richards reported that the committee met on November 1 and November 17 to discuss collections and language to clarify a motion passed in the May meeting regarding low G.P.A. applicants. The collection items will be discussed in executive session.

Richards moved that for the upcoming scholarship cycle, accommodations can be considered for scholarship recipients who are reapplying for funding whose G.P.A. is no lower than 1.5 and have submitted a written statement indicating their circumstances. This does not apply to new applicants. SECOND: Chair Callwood

Comments were made by Genevieve Whitaker, in her capacity as a member of the CTE Board. She said the Board has been working collaboratively with the VIDE on a CT state plan. Mary Moorehead asked if the Board has a policy for addressing public comments and if PRR is open to reviewing the cell phone policy, which the Commissioner has mentioned. AED Prentice said an invitation has been sent to the school monitors for a meeting on cell phones and other policy related items.

Ms. Noorhassan, President of the Ricardo Richards PTA thanked the Board for the invite and valuable information and said she would be following up on the walktrough.
